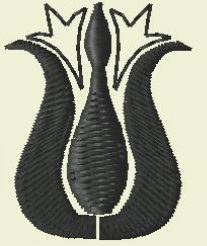
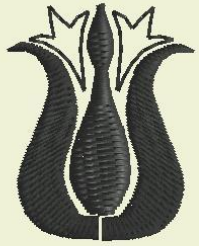

- The fiber and jewelry artisans incorporated wood in the design and named their critter “Bob” to salute their wounded teammate



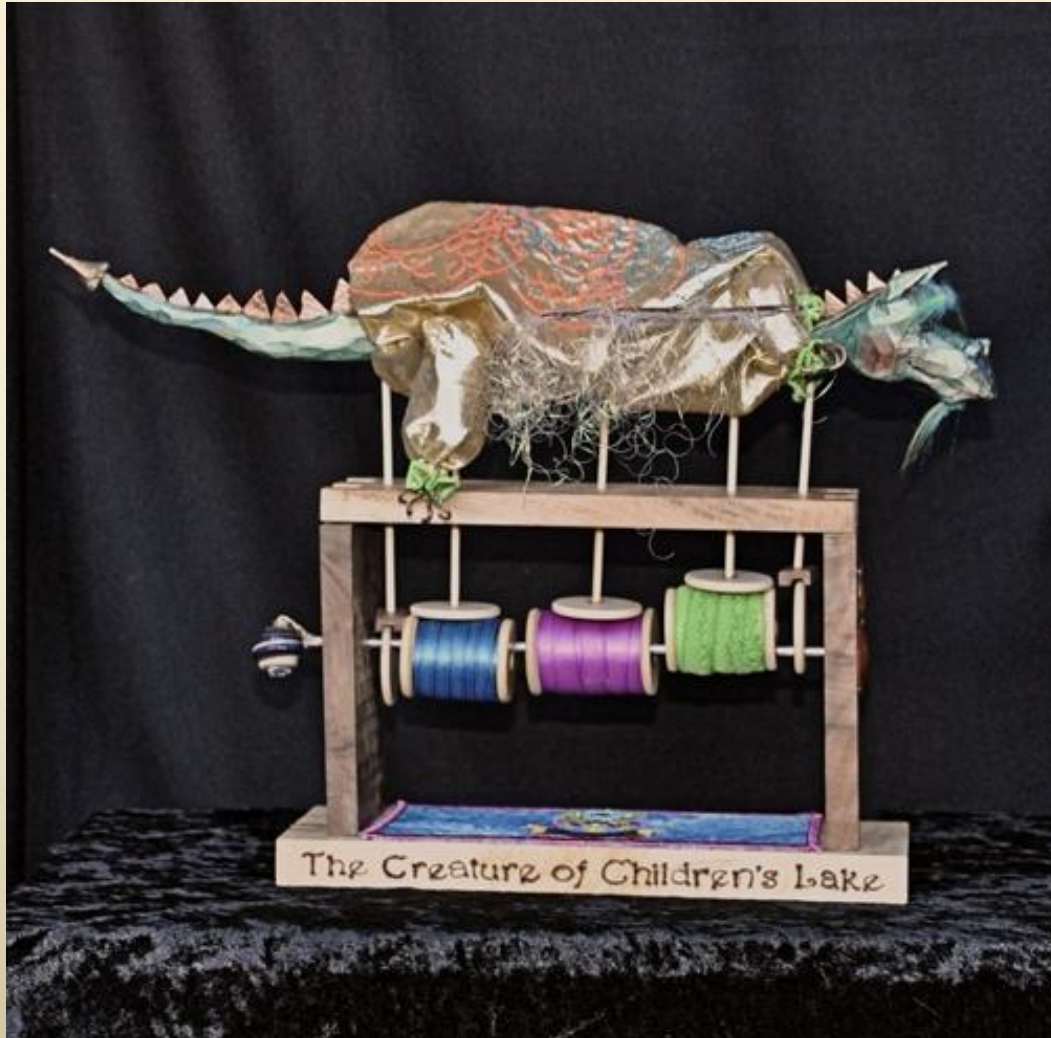
Bubbles: The Creature of Children's Lake

Team: **Gothic Creations Limited**

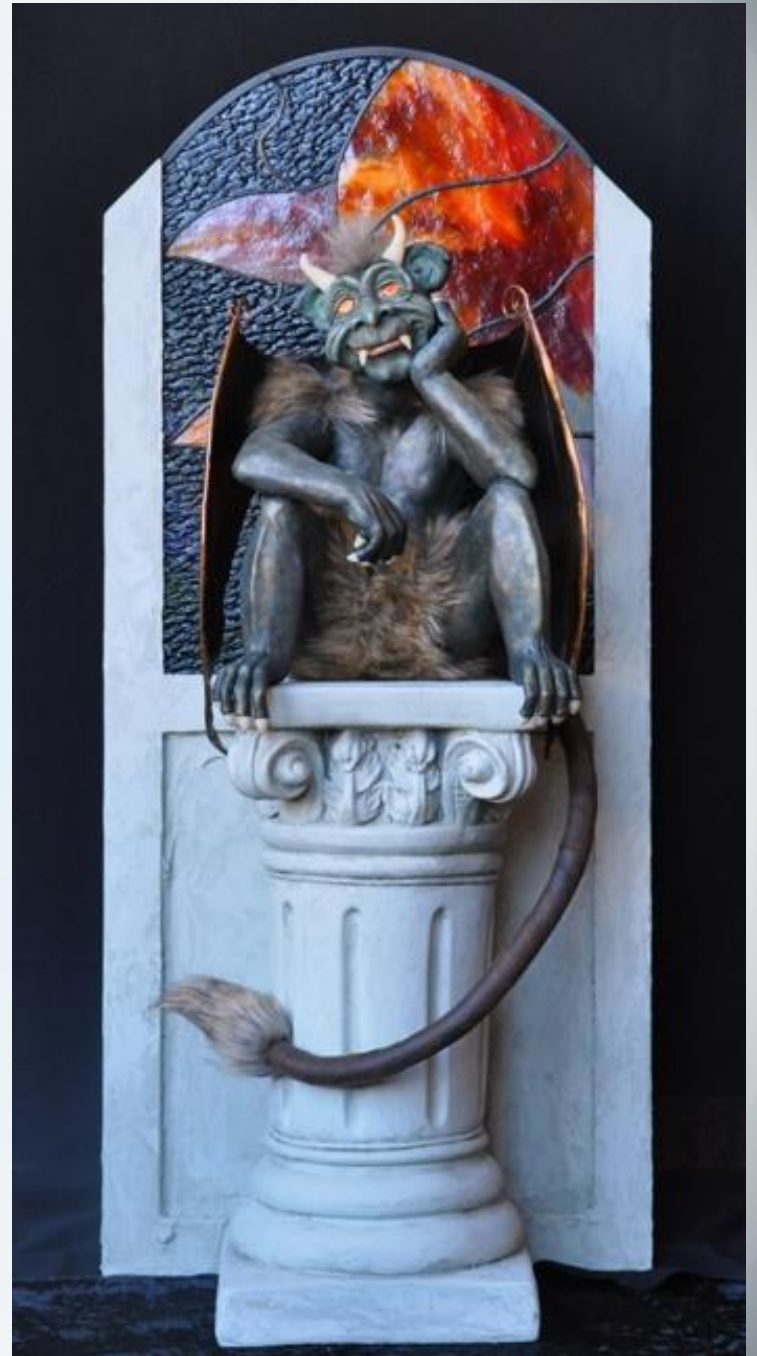
Dan Hayward – Fused and Stained Glass

Distinctions:

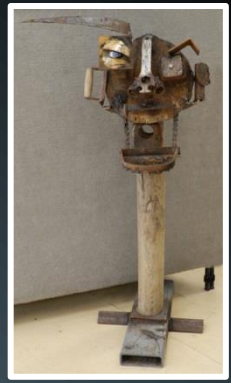
- Time Flies came to life around a table littered with found objects, complimented later with kiln-formed items
